SITUATION OVERVIEW

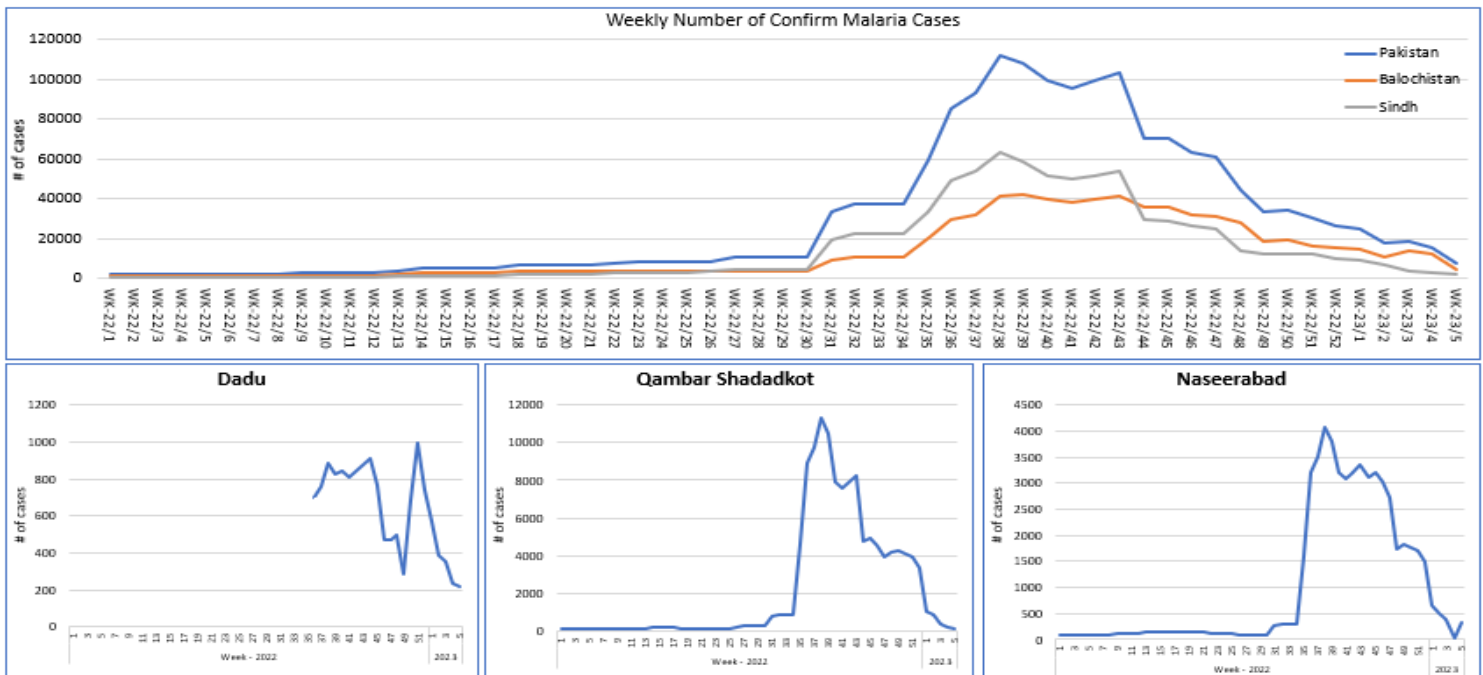

- Current floods situation
 - Sindh Province: an estimated 40,040 people remain displaced from their homes, 6,152 people are living in 4 tent cities / villages and 315 persons are still in relief camp established at District Matiari (PDMA Sindh)
 - Balochistan Province: patches of stagnant water still present in few UCs of districts Naseerabad, Jhal Magsi, Jaffarabad, Usta Muhammad and Sohbatpur, All the IDPs camps are closed.
- Disease outbreaks
 - The daily incidence of malaria continues to decline in all districts however, there are continued pockets of outbreaks in some flood-affected districts of Sindh and Balochistan.
 - Last case of Cholera was confirmed on 16th Jan 2023 in Pakistan.
- Access to health services (RMNCH and management of SAM with complications) remains a challenge in some of the return areas.

Number of Confirm Malaria Cases from Week 1, 2022 to Week 5 2023 (Source: DHIS-2/DMC)



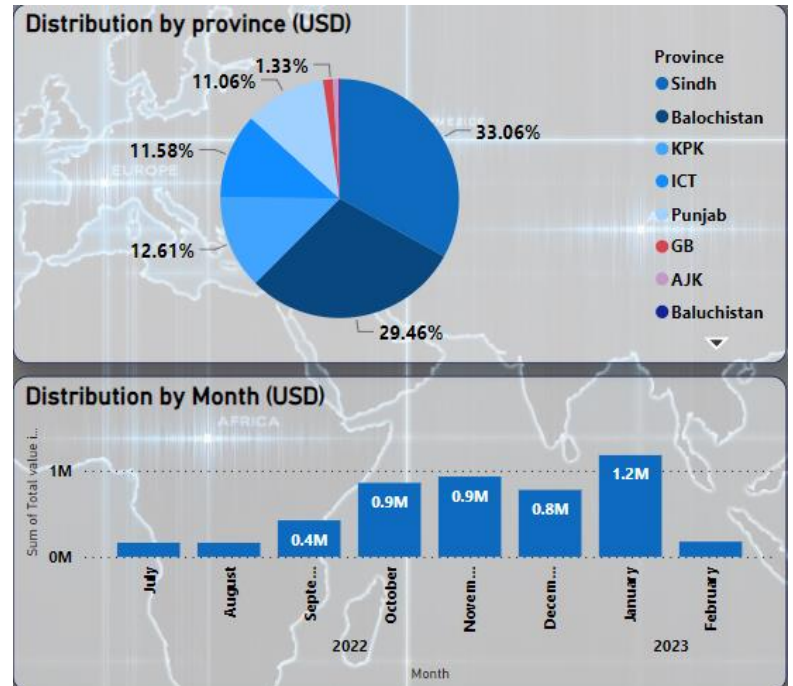
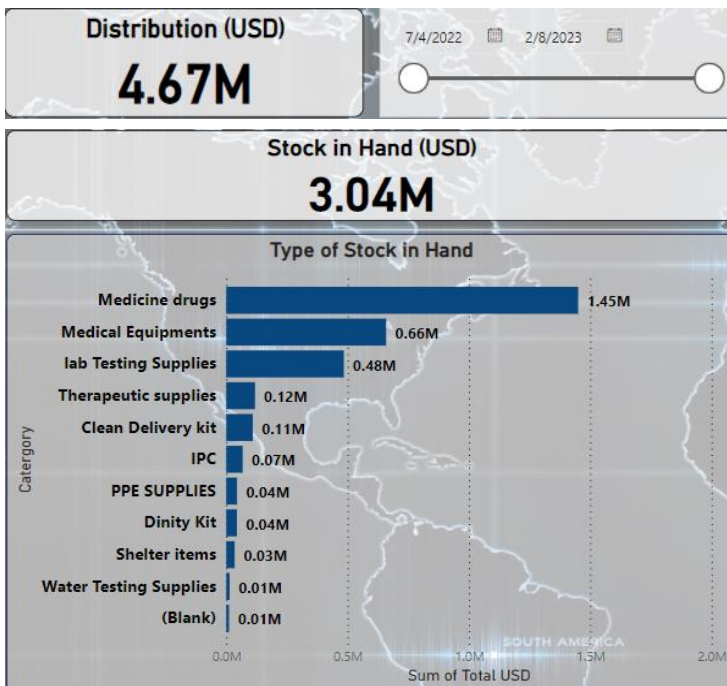


WHO RESPONSE

- Implementation of the joint UN operational plan for SRH/ RMNCAH response in the flood affected districts of Pakistan.
 - WHO has completed distribution of essential equipment to 131 labor rooms across 40 districts.
- Response to pocket of outbreaks of malaria in districts of Sindh and Balochistan Province.
 - Mass Drug Administration using Artemether+ Lumefantrine has been conducted in 2 localities (Bhakkar Jamali and Rajo Dero) in district Dadu, where positivity rate is above 70% and falciparum ratio is 80%. 6,000 people benefited from this exercise.
 - Distributed the second trench of Malaria RDTs, and medicines to flood affected districts of Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Balochistan provinces.
 - Distributed Long-lasting insecticidal nets to 2500 people in Bhakkar Jamali district Dadu, Sindh.
 - Plans for IRS campaign for the remaining households in Sohbatpur town has been finalized. The campaign is scheduled for late February 2023
 - Entomological and epidemiological investigation of malaria vector is planned in districts Gwadar, Panjgur, Zhob, Lasbella, Kech, Awaran, Bolan, Jhal Magsi, Mastung, Chagai, Loralai, Killa Abdullah, Hernai).
- Support to NSC
 - WHO provided equipment and supplies to 04 new Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs) in Balochistan.
