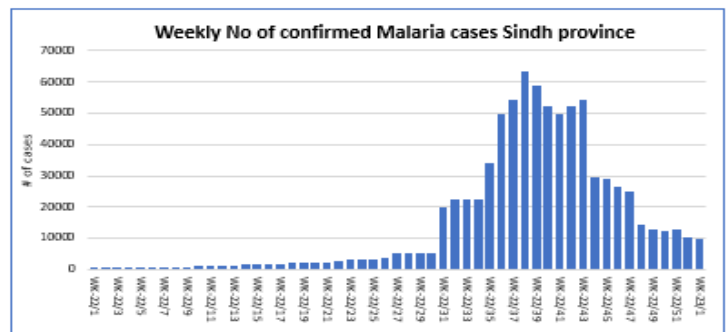

- Flood water has receded from all districts of Balochistan except in some areas of Sohbatpur district.
- In Sindh Province, 87,537 people remain displaced, of these: 7,451 people are in 07 tent cities/villages, established by DDMAs/ Deputy Commissioners (PDMA Sindh, 13 Jan 2023).
- An estimated 5 million people remain exposed to or living close to the flooded areas (Analysis of the United Nations satellite imagery of flood extent).
- There is continued need to monitor and respond to pockets of outbreaks of Acute Respiratory Tract Infections, Malaria and Diarrhea in the flood affected districts.
- The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has prepared the “National Contingency Plan, Winter 2022-23” in collaboration with all stakeholders at federal and provincial levels. The plan is guiding the response to winter.

Number of Confirm Malaria Cases from Week 1, 2022 to Week 1 2023 (source DHIS-2 /DOMC)



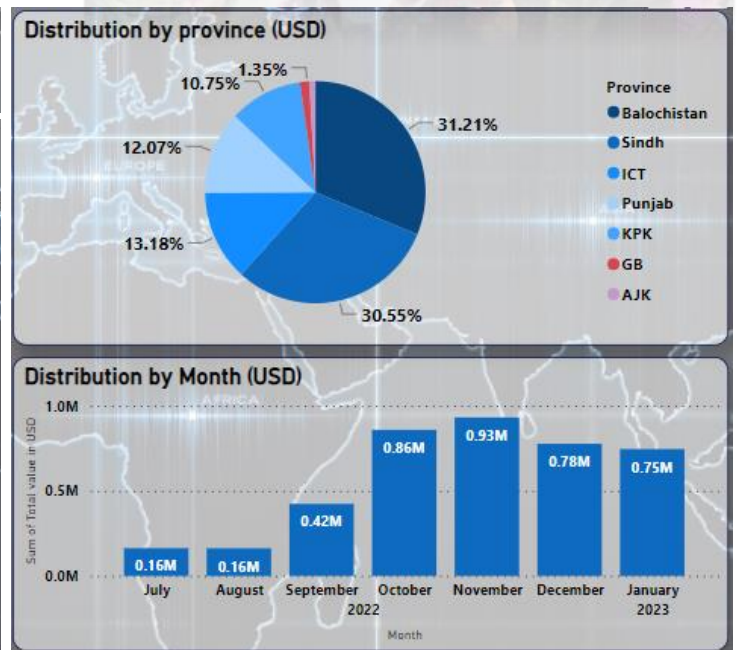
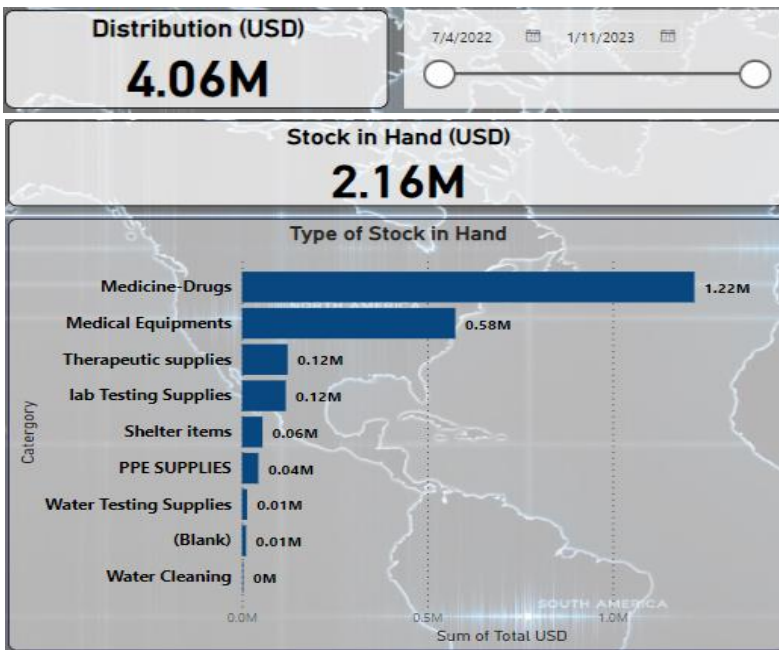


WHO RESPONSE

- On 9th January 2023, WHO donated three (03) mobile health clinics, 01 mobile labour room and an assortment of essential medicines and medical supplies worth PKR 15 million for flood affected Districts of Balochistan.
- WHO continues to support 813 AWD/Cholera sentinel surveillance sites across the country through the provision of RDTs kits for Cholera testing, sample collection and transport media for safe transportation of samples, human resources for the laboratory and capacity building for the laboratory staff.
- WHO in collaboration with the health partners conducted 117 community awareness sessions and 78 sessions for LHWs on Prevention & Response to Sexual Exploitation, Abuse & Harassment (PRSEAH). Over 4,680 persons directly benefited from the awareness sessions. It is anticipated that 32,760 persons will indirectly benefit from the exercise.
- In 41 districts, WHO along with public health institutes of health conducted sessions on provision of community-based case management, mental health care, psycho-social support, and referral services for GBV and SEA. 82 Training sessions conducted for LHWs, LHSs and 2,460 participants have been trained. 123 mobile psycho-social support stations at BHU level have been established.
- To support response to the AWD/Cholera control in District West and District South Karachi, WHO provided social mobilizers to conduct community mobilization campaigns, distribute IEC materials and aqua tablets.
