

# SITUATION OVERVIEW

- Population movement following floods.
  - 5,132 people are still living in 1 operational tent city in district Malir Karachi, Sindh Province. Rest of the displaced people in all other provinces have returned to their place of origin following the floods of July/August 2022.
- Monitoring Diseases Trend in flood affected districts.
  - The COVID-19 positivity rate in Pakistan has decreased to 2.22% from 3.05% in Epi week 10. Lahore, Karachi, Mirpur, and Faisalabad are among the most affected districts.
  - Patches of stagnant water still exist in some of the flood affected districts in Pakistan. There is need to continue monitoring the trends of waterborne and Vector borne diseases in these districts.




WHO Pakistan organized an integrated health camp at BHU Golra, Islamabad to commemorate 75th anniversary of the WHO.

#### • Support to RMNCAH services:

While on technical support supervision to Gilgit Baltistan from 10<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> April 2023, the WHO Country Representative Pakistan, handed over a donation of five sets of delivery tables, bed screens and baby warmers to the Governor Gilgit Baltistan Mr Syed Mehdi Shah. In attendance were, Secretary Health Mr Sana Ullah and MNCH Director Dr Nuzhat Shafi. The Governor of Gilgit Baltistan appreciated WHO Pakistan for the donation.

#### Support to Nutrition Services:

 A total of 14,300 Severely Malnourished children with complications, have been managed in the 80 WHO supported Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs) in flood affected areas across Pakistan. Out of the total 91.14% children cured, 1.42% died and 4.90% defaulted.

#### WHO's Supported Medical Relief Camps:

WHO Pakistan in collaboration with the District Health Office Islamabad conducted an integrated health camp in BHU Golra, Islamabad. The health camp offered immunization services, TB screening, MNCH services, and nutrition services. In addition WHO provided free medicines to the patients. This is one of the activities organized to commemorate the World Health Day and the 75th anniversary of WHO.











