# **SITUATION OVERVIEW**

### Population movement following floods.

- In Balochistan, the community in UC Dodeka and Gadi-Sohabatpur, is still in temporary houses due to patches of standing flood water.
- In Sindh province, 26,203 people remain displaced within the districts of Shikarpur, Mirpur Khas, Jacobabad, and Thatta, while 5,132 people reside in one tent city in the district Malir Karachi.

#### • Monitoring Diseases Trend in flood affected districts.


- A slight increase in the daily number of new COVID-19 cases has been observed recently, and the test positivity rate has reached 2.98% in the country. NCOC (CDC-NIH) has advised people to use masks in crowded places amid the rise in COVID-19 cases.
- The second phase of the IRS campaign, selected MDA, larval control, and LLINs distribution launched in district Sohbatpur on March 13, 2023. A total 80 spray men trained in IRS techniques, many, doctors trained on malaria case management and large number of community health workers were trained on the Mass Drug Administration in the district.

# **PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS**

### • Support to RMNCAH services:

- WHO in collaboration with the Punjab Department of Health conducted a 3-day training on Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) for the health care providers of flood affected districts Rajanpur and Dera Ghazi Khan (DG Khan) in Punjab. A Total of 21 participants including doctors, nurses, and midwives from the secondary level healthcare facilities of the districts attended the training. After this training, KMC centers will be established in DG Khan and Rajanpur that will help save lives of preterm and low-birth-weight newborns in the flood-affected districts.
- Trained 20 Lady Health Supervisors (LHS) on Home Base Newborn Care from the district of Matiari in Hyderabad.
- Trained 34 health care providers from the secondary care hospitals Khairpur, Ghotki, Shikarpur, Kambar Shahdad Kot, Larkana, and Community Midwife school in Sukkur on Early Essential Newborn Care (EENC).

## • Support to Nutrition services:

- A total of 12,108 children have been treated to date in the 74 functional, WHO supported NSCs in flood affected areas across Pakistan. Out of the 12,108 children admitted to the NSCs, 93.26% cured, 1.58% died and 5.16% defaulted.
- Four-day capacity building workshops on inpatient management of severe acute malnutrition with complications were conducted in DHQ Hospital Haripur and Molvi G Hospital Peshawar from March 13-16, 2023. A total of 26 health care providers participated in the workshops.




Training on Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) in DG Khan, Punjab. 15-17 March 2023


