

C SITUATION OVERVIEW

Monitoring of Diseases Trend


- Pakistan reported 74,860 cases of malaria in March 2023 and 75,185 cases of malaria in April 2023 as compared to 14,371 cases of malaria in March 2022 and 23,562 cases of malaria in April 2022. The comparison shows an increase of more than 3 times in cases of malaria in 2022 as compared to 2023. Districts reporting high number of cases of malaria include Larkana, Thatta, Qambar Shahdad Kot and Umerkot from Sindh province and Jaffar Abad, Kech and Kachhi from Balochistan province. There is need to continue monitoring the malaria trends, institute preparedness measures and implement control activities as we move towards the peak transmission season.
- COVID-19 positivity rate continues to decline in Pakistan. The positivity rate is 0.37% as of epi-week 20, down from 0.64% as of epi week 19 of 2023. Lahore, Sargodha, Karachi, and Islamabad are reporting high number of cases.



WHO RESPONSE

2nd Joint External Evaluation (JEE):

- Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination with technical and financial support from WHO is conducting the 2nd Joint External Evaluation (JEE) for assessing the implementation of International Health Regulations (IHR) core capacities.
- The JEE was officially launched on 15th May 2023 at Serena Hotel Islamabad. During his opening remarks, The WHO Country representative Pakistan applauded Pakistan for the substantial progress made on the implementation of the recommendations of the 1st JEE conducted in 2016. He emphasized on the importance of regular conducting JEE as a tool to monitor the implementation of IHR core capacity with a vision to establish Pakistan as a country maintaining internationally recognized standards for global and national health security.

Support to response to malnutrition:

WHO SUPPORT

- As of 15th May 2023, 18,464 children have been treated in 65 WHO supported NSCs in flood affected areas across Pakistan. Out of the total 94.38% children cured, 1.2% died and 4.42% defaulted.
- During the reporting week, WHO provided F-75 & F-100 (F-75: 59 Carton "1,416 Tins" & F-100: 44 Carton "1,056 Tins") to support 15 Nutrition Stabilization Centers supported by Accelerated Action Program, Government of Sindh. 1,000 children with SAM and complication will benefit from the support.
- WHO conducted Maternal, Infant and Young Child Feeding and Nutrition (MIYCN) counseling sessions in DHQ Panjgur, Balochistan Province.





