### SITUATION OVERVIEW

- Population movement following floods.**

No displaced population in Pakistan following floods except in Sindh Province, where an estimated 26,203 people remain displaced from their homes, of which 5,132 people live in one operational tent city.

- Living condition in return areas.**

The community in UCs Dodeka and Gadi, district Sohbatpur, Balochistan, are still living in temporary housing due to stagnant flood water.

- MoU signed between the Gov of Balochistan and WHO.**

On 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2023 the Government of Balochistan and WHO signed MoU to repair/renovate 100 PHC facilities in 12 flood affected districts.

- COVID-19 pandemic.**

The COVID-19 positivity rate in Pakistan is 3.58%. Most affected districts/cities are Muzaffarabad, Islamabad, Peshawar, Lahore, Multan, and Karachi.

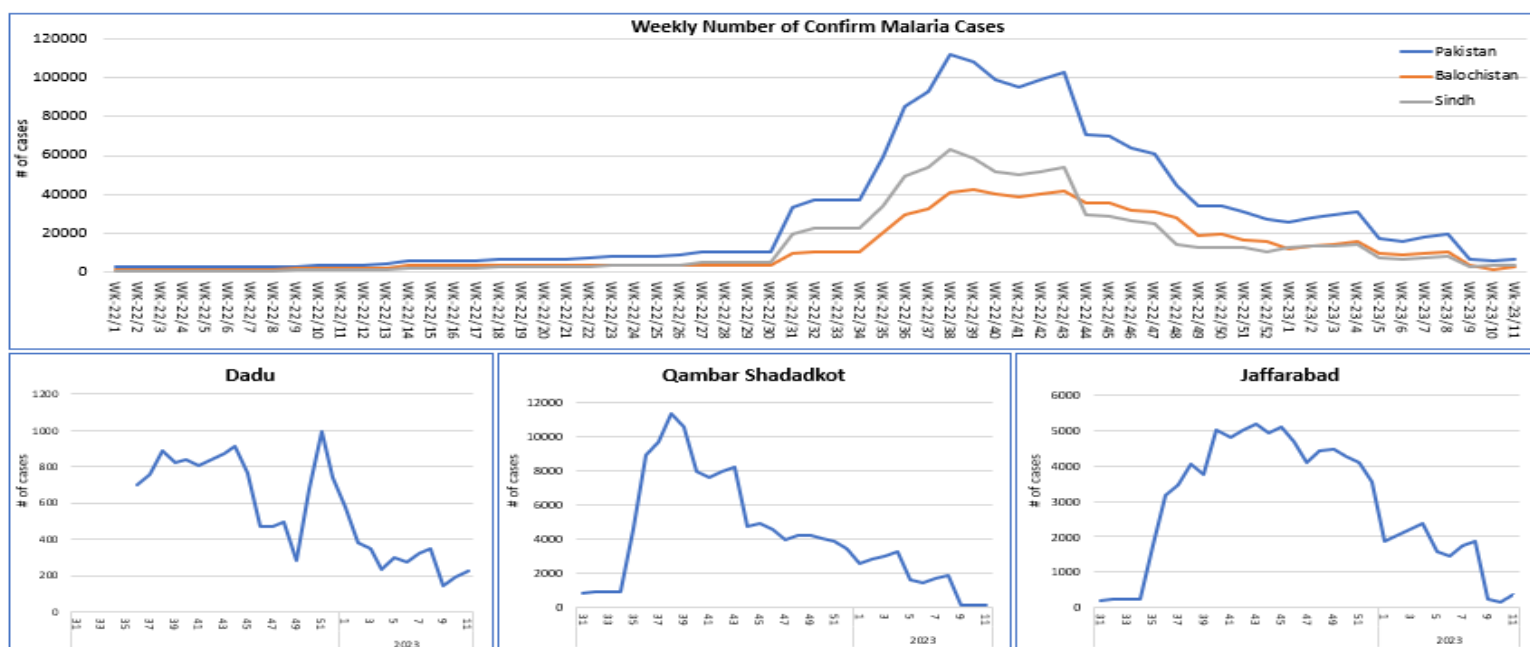

## WHO RESPONSE

### Support to RMNCAH services:

- WHO donated equipment for labor rooms and Gyne/Obs operation theatres to Provincial Sandeman Hospital, Bolan Medical Hospital Complex, and Mufti Mehmood Hospital in Quetta. In addition, WHO donated ten thousand clean delivery kits and hygiene kits to MNCH program for flood affected districts and Afghan Refugee districts.
- WHO Pakistan in collaboration with Department of Health Sindh, held a three-day Early Essential Newborn Care (EENC) workshop at Shaikh Zayed Women's Hospital, Larkana. The workshop was attended by 34 participants from WHO supported health facilities in Sukkur, Ghotki, Khairpur, Qambar Shehdadkot, Shikarpur and Tutors of Community Midwifery school and Lady Health Visitors, Women Medical Officers and staff Nurses of secondary hospitals.

### Support to Nutrition Services:

- Repair and renovation of NSCs at Dera Allahyar (Jafferabad), DHQ Zhob, DHQ Barkhan, and Qilla Saifullah in Balochistan is complete. Two NSCs, at DHQ Musa Khel & DHQ Hernai are still under Repairs and renovations.

### Support to EPI Program:

- WHO Pakistan donated vehicles to Provincial Coordinator EPI.

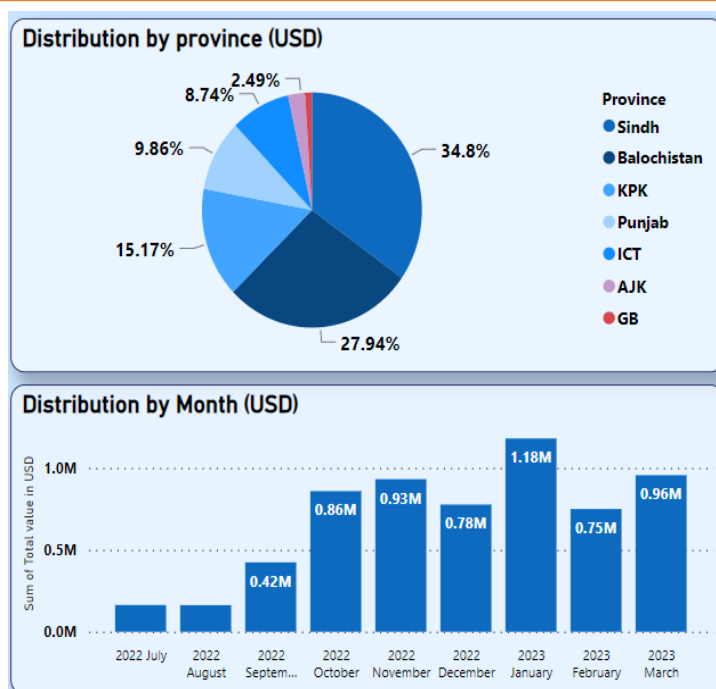
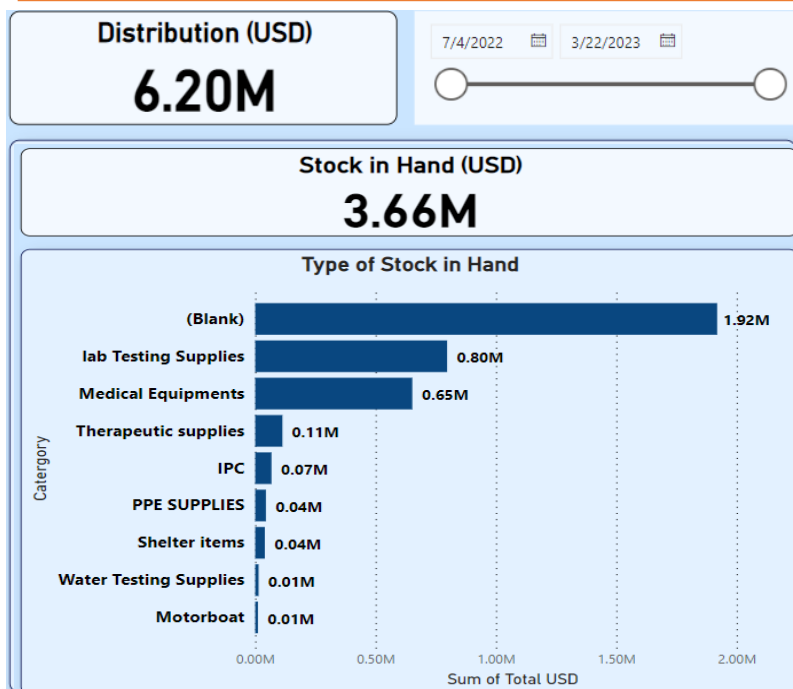

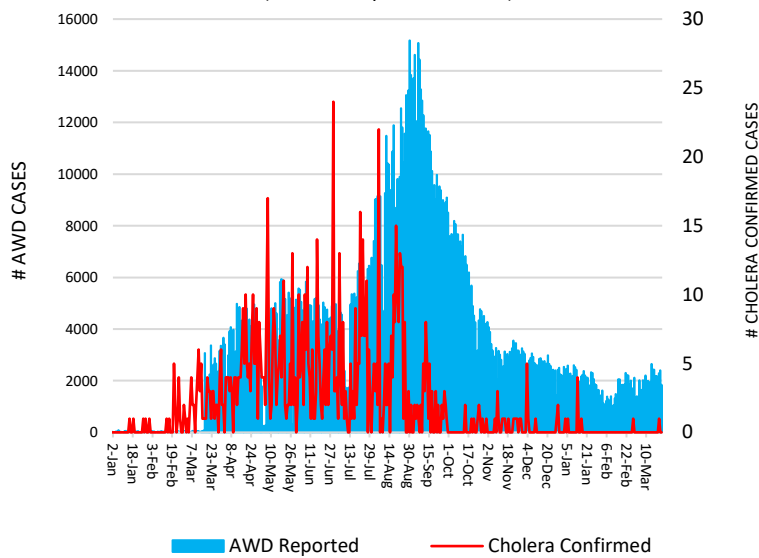

## AWD/Cholera Situation in Pakistan as of 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2023

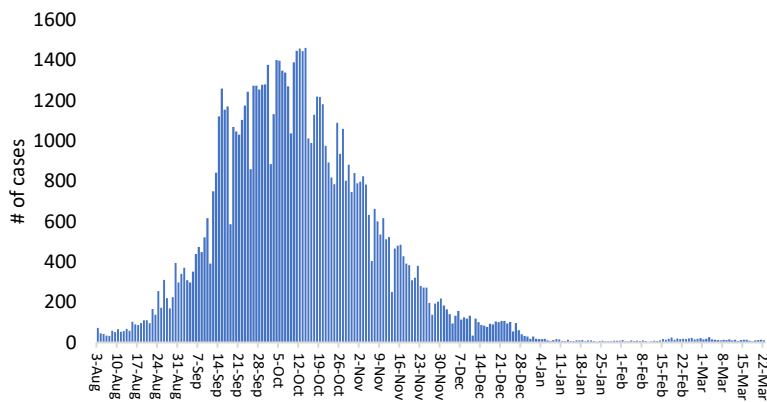
Daily AWD & Cholera Confirmed Cases Pakistan  
(2nd January 2022 till date)



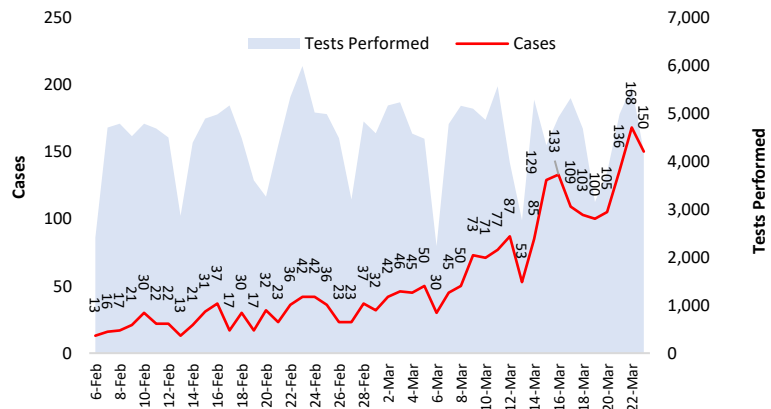
