



SITUATION OVERVIEW

- More than 2.8 million (62%) population of the originally displaced people have moved back to their place of origin while approximately 1.7 million are still displaced and needs to go back to their homes. (Provincial Disaster Management Authority, Sindh)
- The Government of Pakistan support from BISP flood relief assistant program has provided 67.16 (97.3%) billion PKR to 2.76 million beneficiaries (NDMA)
- The OPV/Penta/PCV/Rota, MR-I and IPV-I outreach activities have been launched in 33 districts of Balochistan and 34 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in November. People reached as of 23rd Nov 2022 are 104,709 for OPV/Penta/PCV/Rota-1, 111,622 for MR I and 83,608 for IPV-I. All flood-affected districts are included in the outreach activities.

Health partner response




- During the reporting week, 200,060 individuals benefited from SRH services including more than 2100 safe deliveries conducted and 1,500 clean delivery kits provided to pregnant women to promote as well as to ensure clean delivery practices.
- More than 450 healthcare providers including LHV's, women medical officers, CMW's and medical technicians are engaged to provide BEmONC services in 73 static health facilities, visiting communities through 65 Mobile Outreach Teams and strengthening Comprehensive EmONC in 9 health facilities.
- Inception meeting have been conducted for Director General Health and District Health Officers from districts Sanghar, Umerkot, Naushero Feroze and Mirpurkhas to kick start a partnership with Shifa foundation for 16 health facilities with BHA-USAID support.
- 14 out of 30 planned tented health facilities has been installed as an interim measure to kickstart functionality of static health facilities in return areas.
- Rehabilitation of 109 static health facilities across Pakistan, (Sindh 51, Balochistan 20 facilities and 5 warehouses, KPK 19 and Punjab 19) has commenced with partner support.
- 63,000 LHW kits ordered.
- Antimalarial drugs worth 640,585 USD, 750,000 LLINs from China will be distributed in all flood affected districts.
- RDTs, ACT and Primaquine mobilized for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa from Common Management Unit in the Ministry as the stock out was reported.





WHO RESPONSE

- The first consignment of therapeutic milk, 10,368 tins of F75 and 7,680 tins of F100 was received on 24 November 2022 and dispatched to all 67 targeted NSC sites in flood affected areas.
- 21 NSC supported by WHO are fully functional, renovation for 10 has been completed and 36 are under renovation.
- Training of service providers on inpatient management of severe acute malnutrition with complications was conducted in KP for NSC Staff of DHQ Hospital D.I.Khan.
- Malaria case management and entomological surveillance supported through provision of RDTs and antimalaria medicines to replenish stock in outbreak hit districts (100,000 course of ACT, 200,000 RDTs, Primaquine and Chloroquine). 5 million Chloroquine received from MMV.
- The Indoor Residual Spraying (IRS) campaign was completed on 21st November 2022 in district Sohbatpur Balochistan. 2,515 houses and 5,416 structures (rooms) were covered.
