SITUATION OVERVIEW

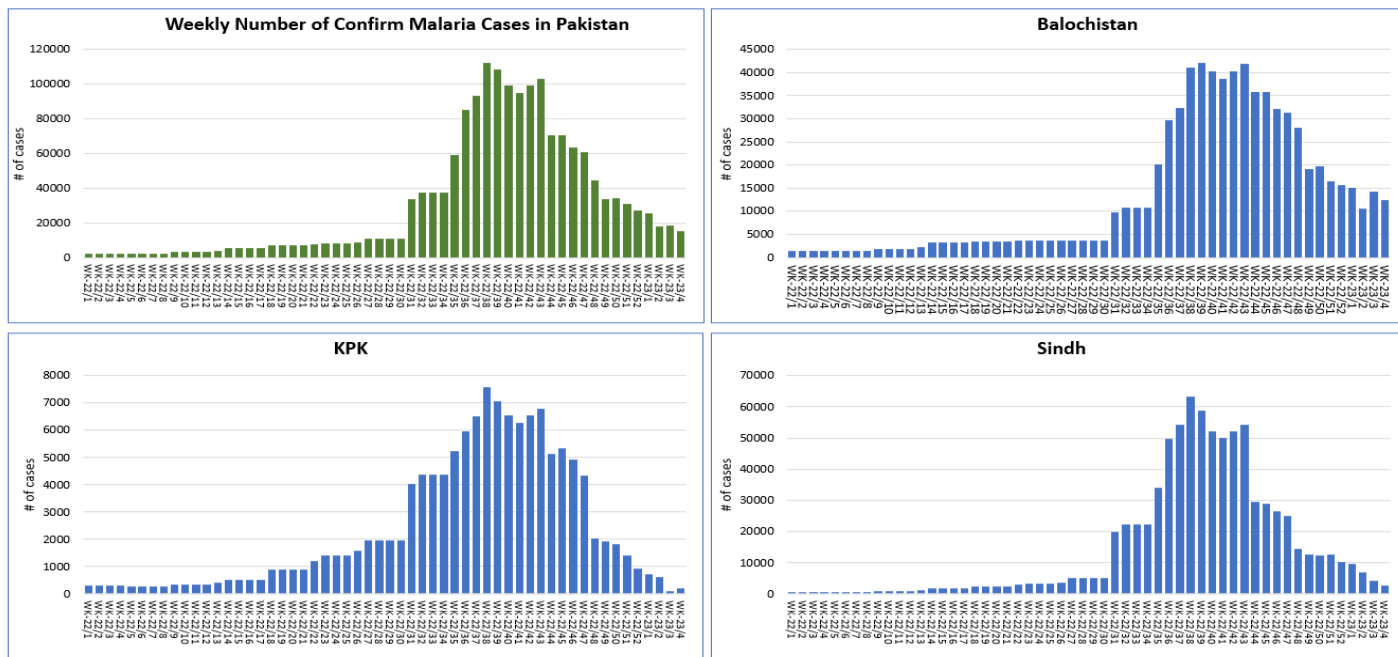

- In Balochistan province, stagnant water is present in few UCs in district Naseerabad, district Jhal Magsi, district Jaffarabad/Usta Mohammad, and district Sohatpur.
- All the IDPs camps in Balochistan have been closed and there are no IDPs left.
- In Sindh province, 6,152 people are living in 4 Tent cities / villages (in district Malir Karachi 5,132, district Jamshoro 700 and district Matiari 320) Source PDMA
- 35 districts in the flood affected areas particularly in high altitude areas have been identified as most exposed to difficult winter conditions. Many of the districts have received heavy snowfall and temperatures have fallen below freezing degrees centigrade.
- The National Disaster Management Authority in collaboration with the federal and provincial stakeholders has prepared the "National Winter Contingency Plan – Winter 2022/23"

Number of Confirm Malaria Cases from Week 1, 2022 to Week 4 2023 (Source: DHIS-2/DMC)



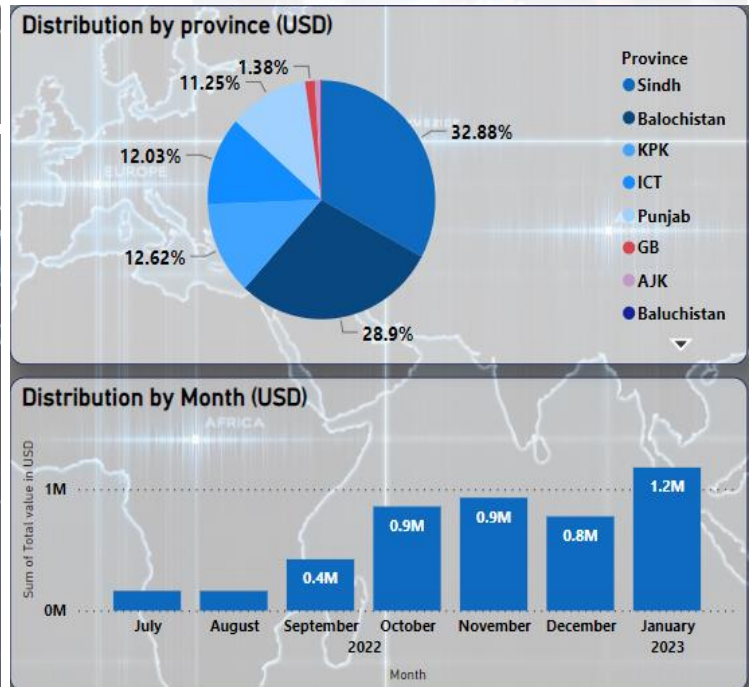
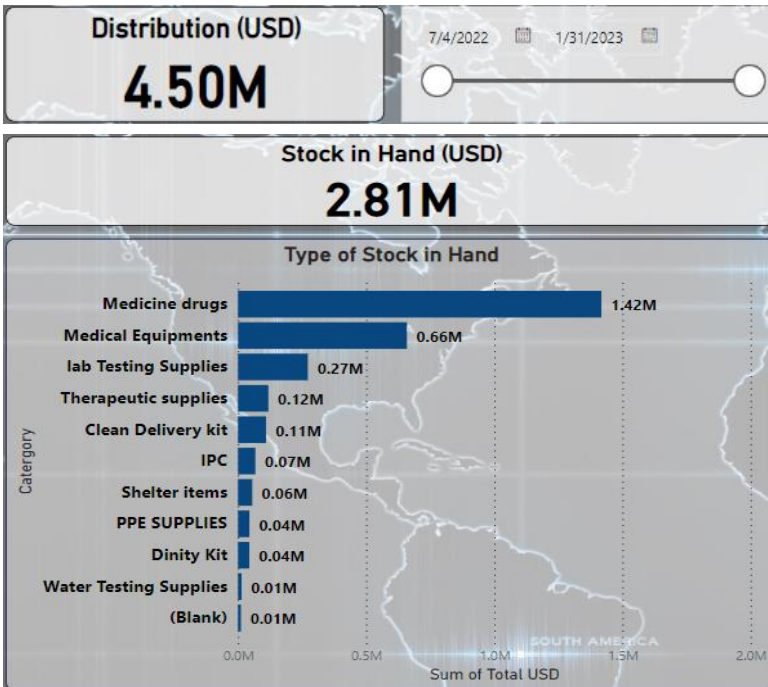


WHO RESPONSE

- WHO Pakistan in collaboration with the Ministry of National Health Services Regulations and Coordination (NHSR&C) and Provincial Health Department in all four provinces is introducing maternal and perinatal sentinel surveillance system in the flood affected districts to monitor maternal and neonatal mortality. The Provincial Health Office are in the process of identifying the sentinel sites.
- WHO trained 68 health care providers (Medical officers, nurses, and pediatricians) on inpatient management of severe acute malnutrition for 10 Nutrition stabilization Centers (NSCs) of Sindh. Trainings for 05 NSCs for Balochistan will begin on February 6, 2023.
- On 1st Feb 2023, WHO Pakistan held partners coordination meeting on malaria outbreak response. During the meeting, current malaria situation, response and gaps in the response were discussed. In addition, priority interventions and way forward were identified. Partners agreed to hold similar coordination meetings every two weeks.
- The second round of Indoor Residual Spraying in district Dadu has been completed. 567 household and 1,144 room were sprayed. In addition, 111 community awareness session on proper use of LLINs, dangers of delayed treatment and the advantages of MDA were conducted.
- In response to the ongoing outbreak of malaria, WHO and Partners are supporting Mass Drug Administration (MDA) using Artemether Lumefantrine in 2 villages of Johi Taluka in district Dadu.
