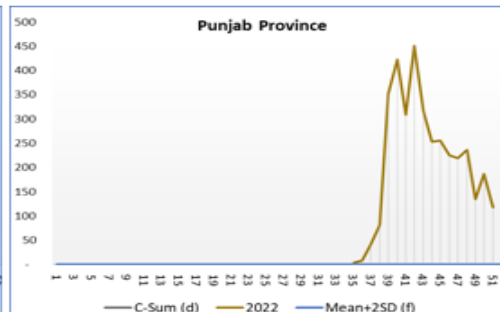
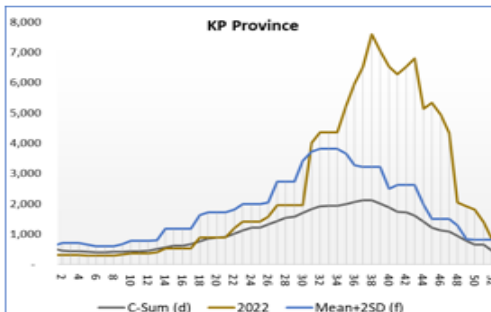
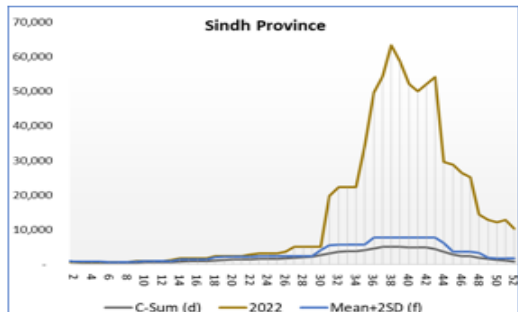
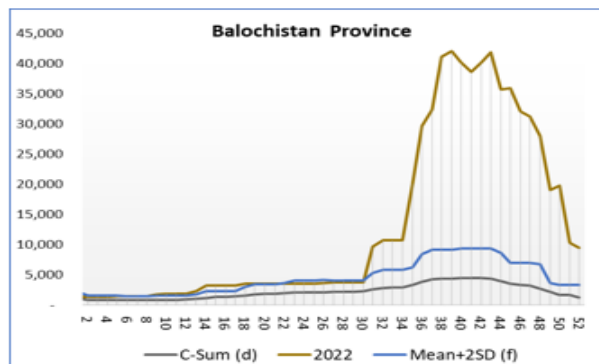
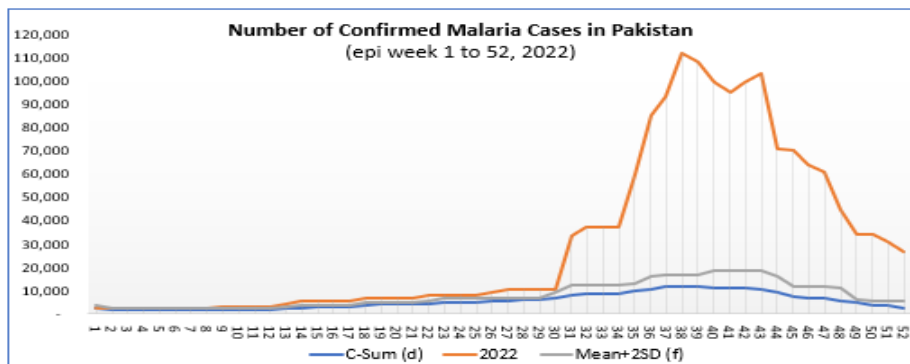
SITUATION OVERVIEW

- In Balochistan province flood water has receded in most parts of the province except the districts of Jhal Magsi and Sohbatpur.
- There are no IDPs, and all camps are closed in Balochistan Province. (According to commissioner, Nasirabad Division). Similarly, there are no IDP camps in Punjab Province.
- In Sindh province, 89,157 people are still displaced and 16,201 people are living in 19 tent cities/ villages (PDMA Sindh).
- In Sindh Province, ten (10) health facilities are still under water as detailed below: in district Dadu (7) and Khairpur (3) (DoH Sindh)
- A total of 5.5 million patients have been treated for different health conditions between 1st July 2022 and 5th January 2023, through 32,032 Medical camps established by department of health and partners in Sindh province.

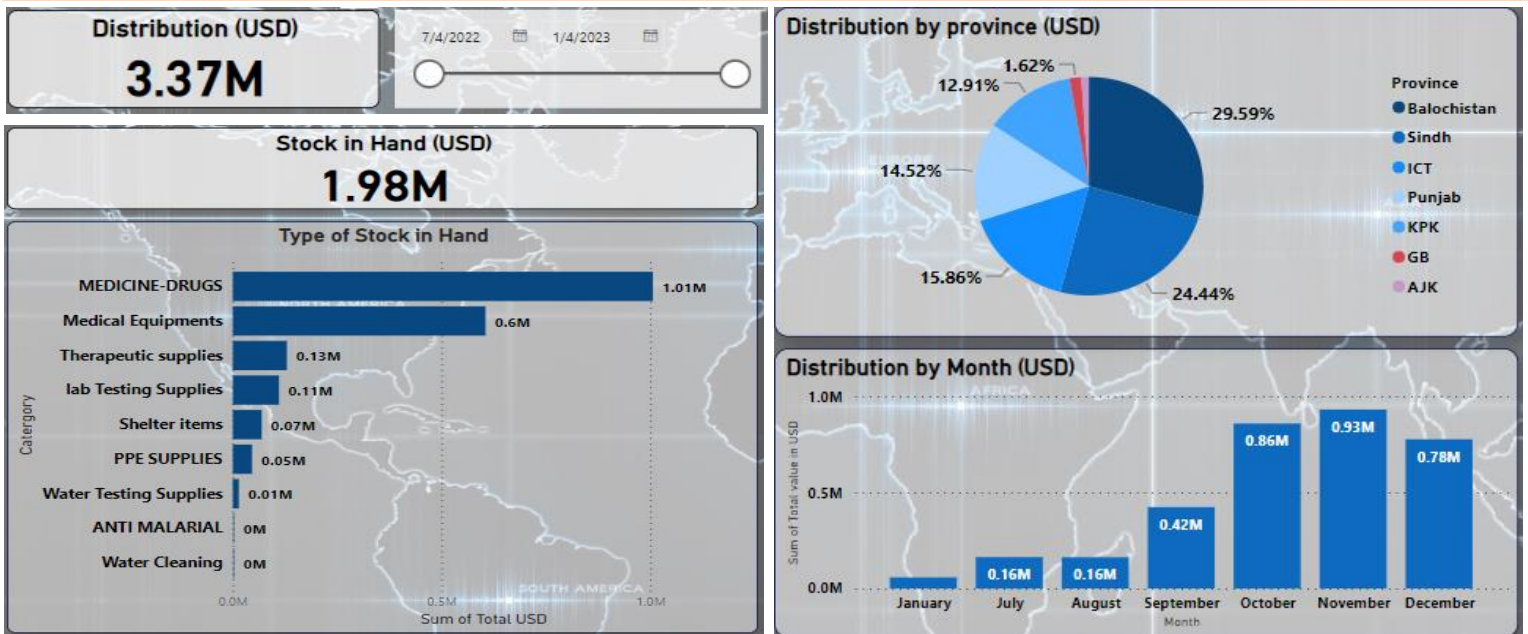


WHO RESPONSE

- WHO providing RMNCH support in 40 districts across all 4 provinces for strengthening of 131 BEmONC, 16 CEmONC, 14 Newborn ICU and 8 KMC centers. The support included but not limited to:
 - Provision of 2 mobile delivery vans, to department of health, Sindh and Balochistan
 - Renovation of 69 labor rooms, postnatal wards, and newborn ICUs.
- WHO is supporting the establishment/strengthening of 89 Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs) across the country including 58 new centers, strengthening 31 existing centers with provision of therapeutic milk (F-100 and F-75). 20 out of 58 newly established NSCs are functional with 1,360 children enrolled and 946 (69.56%) Children cured and discharged. Furthermore 5,222 children were enrolled in the other 31 WHO supported NSCs for treatment of SAM with complications. A total of 6,582 children have benefited from the 51 NSC from August to December 2022.
- WHO Supported the three (3) HIV and Viral Hepatitis Testing camps organized by the Association of People Living with HIV (APLHIV) in flood affected areas in KP and Sindh Province. WHO provided HIV & Viral Hepatitis Rapid Diagnostic Kits (RDTs), 600 Alle Determine, 80 SD Biloine, 200 HCV and 100 HBV kits to CDC's Division of Viral Hepatitis and HIV Sindh Province.
- WHO Supported 85,951 health awareness sessions in 37 calamity hit districts and 519,405 community members attended the sessions. 15,443 LHWs, 519 LHSs and 430 CSOs including social mobilizers trained on waterborne, Vector-borne diseases, and Infection Prevention Control (IPC).
