SITUATION OVERVIEW


Cases of malaria, Cholera, Acute Watery Diarrheal diseases, and Dengue continues to decline in most districts.

- Government plans are underway to reconstruct all 7,878 health houses for lady health workers (LHWs). The total cost of the plan is 9.879 billion PKR.
- PDMA Sindh distributed tents (> 800,000), plastic tarpaulin (>580,000), Mosquito nets (> 3.7 million), ration bags (2.38 million), RO Plants (28), jerry cans (> 112,000), folding beds (>8,000), kitchen sets (>57,000) etc., to the floods affected population.
- In November 2022, 70 suspected cases of Diphtheria were reported from the flood affected provinces of KP, Sindh and Punjab.




WHO RESPONSE

- On 29th November 2022, WHO inaugurated a 18 bedded NSC centre in Liyari General Hospital, Karachi.
- A total of 103,252 under five children were screened in Sindh, out of which 579 were identified as severe acute malnutrition with complications and referred to NSCs for clinical interventions.
- Distributed F-75 (41,472 tins) and F-100 (31,008 tins) to the nutrition stabilization centers (NSCs) in the provinces.
- A total of 5,754 LHWs, 176 LHSs and 70 CSOs were trained on Reproductive Maternal, Neonatal and Child Health (RMNCH), and Psychosocial Support in Sindh, Balochistan and KP.
- WHO supported training of 80 health care providers drawn from districts Sohbatpur and Kambar Shdad on Malaria case management.
- The IRS and larviciding campaign launched in Qambar Shahdad Kot on 26th Nov in collaboration with Provincial VBDs Program Sindh is in progress. The campaign targets >7,000 households in 5 high transmission localities.

On 1st December 2022, WHO Regional Director Eastern Mediterranean Dr Ahmed Al-Mandhari and WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala handed over a donation worth over USD one million to Federal Minister for Health H.E Mr Abdul Qadir Patel at WHO Country Office Islamabad. The event was attended by Ambassadors and Representatives of the donors and partners. The donation included 10 Mobile Medical camps vehicles, 2 mobile labor room, 7 mini ambulances, 3 mobile vaccination vans and assortment of medical supplies.
