



INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **1,262** new cases of COVID-19 on **12**th **February 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **561,625** with **12,276** deaths **(CFR: 2.18%)**. Out of the total **25,649** currently active cases **2,143** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

WHO supports Government of Baluchistan's policy initiative of expanding Telemedicine services in the province to improve access to quality healthcare for the underserved rural communities. To that effect, WHO Pakistan in collaboration with the Department of Health Balochistan on 9th and 11th February 2021 inaugurated two Telemedicine clinics, in districts Loralai and Khuzdar respectively. The telemedicine clinics are established in collaboration with the Government of Balochistan and "Sehat Kahani". These clinics will help to improve access to quality Reproductive Health services to the rural community in Balochistan and generate evidence on the scalability of the model in the province through public resources. Dr Ali Nasir Bugti, Director General Health Services Balochistan and Dr Shah Jehan Panezai, Director Health Zhob Division, inaugurated the clinics in Khuzdar and Loralai respectively. The inaugurations were attended by Deputy Commissioners, District Health Officers, Superintendents, and members of local community along with the WHO technical team from country and provincial office.
