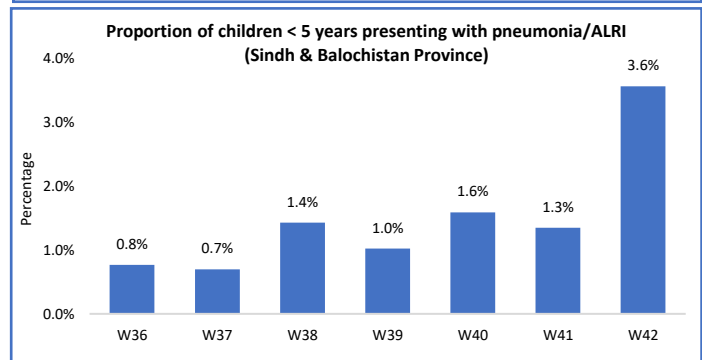
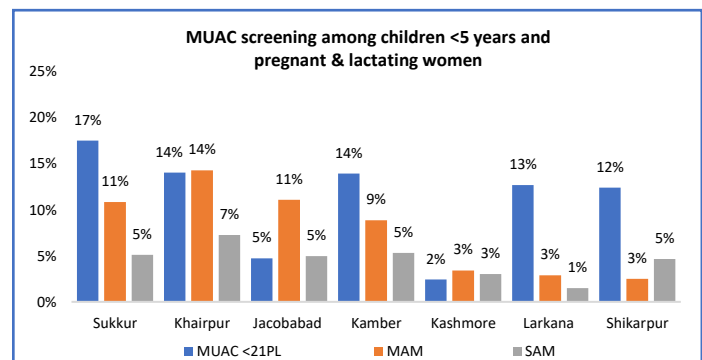
SITUATION OVERVIEW

- In the flood-affected areas, around 8 million people need urgent essential healthcare
- Out of the over 6 million displaced people in Sindh province 3 million have returned to their place of origin.
- In Balochistan province around 200,000 people (50%) of the displaced population have returned to their place of origin.
- The number of cases of water-borne and vector-borne diseases continue to rise in some areas.
- The government has provided flood relief worth over 66 billion PKR to 2.6 million beneficiaries in cash as part of BISP's flood relief assistance program.



PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

- Malnutrition remains a concern in many areas of the flood affected districts. Result from nutrition screening on 9,409 children < 5 years & 2,787 pregnant/lactating women using MUAC conducted in 17 tehsils of 7 districts in Sindh revealed that MUAC < 21 cm for Pregnant and Lactating women (PL) was found in higher proportions in Shahdad Kot tehsil Kambar district (27%), Pano Aqi tehsil, Sukkur district (22%), and Rohri tehsil, Sukkur district (19%). Similarly, high proportions of MAM in Thari Meer Wah, Khairpur district (17%), and high proportions of SAM with complications in Garhi Khairo, Jacobabad (11%), Nasir Abad, Kambar (10%), and Shahdad Kot, Kambar (8%).
- The proportion of children < 5 years presenting with ARI is increase in Sindh and Balochistan. With lack of proper shelter, exposure to the standing flood waters, overcrowding and the start of winter season, the proportion of ARI cases is expected to increase.



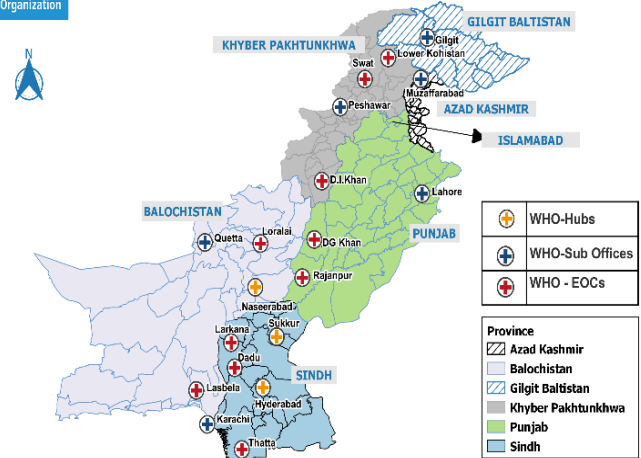


WHO RESPONSE

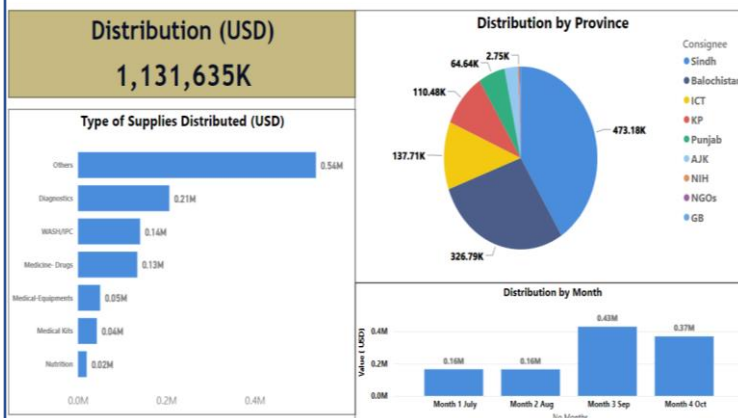
- WHO’s 3 operational hubs and 10 Emergency Operation Centres in the flood affected districts are fully operationalized.
- WHO Polio Eradication Initiative deployed 22 district monitors to 20 districts of Sindh and two districts of Punjab to monitor Expanded Program on Immunization activities in flood affected districts.
- Out of the 330,602-target population in Balochistan for the Measles-Rubella (MR) campaign 289,316 (88%) received vaccine of which 183,002 (60%) were vaccinated in IDP camps.
- The Oral Cholera Vaccination (OCV) campaign in the province of KP is complete. 415,984 (108%) people received the vaccine out of the target population of 383,531 (1 year and above including adults).
- Operation plan has been developed for the flood response between UNICEF, UNFPA, WFP and WHO in the areas of nutrition, WASH and RMNCH
- Joint Interagency PRSEAH Plan has been developed as part of Pakistan flood response 2022-23.



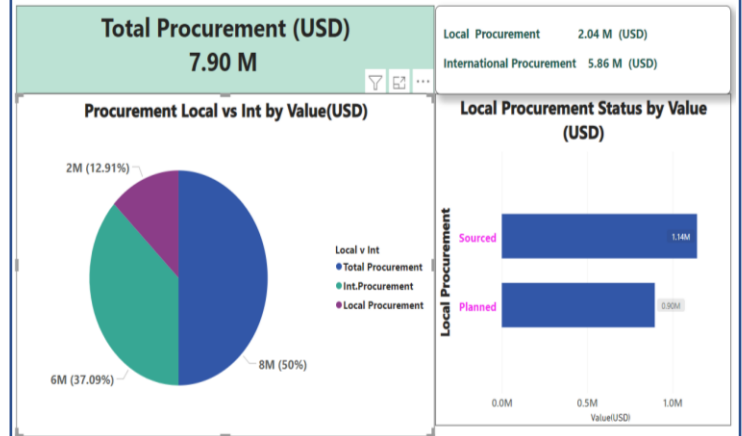
Map showing districts for WHO - EOCs , Hubs and Sub offices for flood response
