SITUATION OVERVIEW

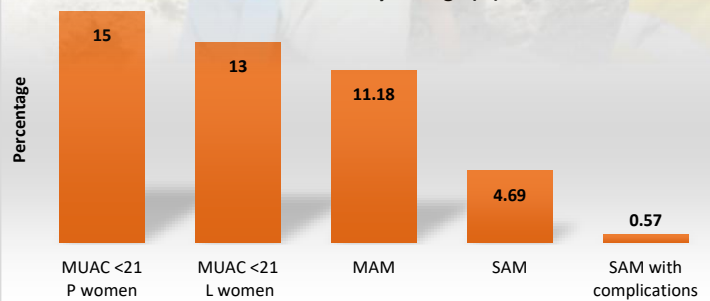
- 100% of displaced people from Punjab (DG Khan and Rajanpur districts) have returned to their places of origin.
- In Naseerabad division (District Bolan, Naseerabad, Jafarabad, Sohabatpur, Jhal Magsi and Usta Mohd) 72% (131) of the health facilities in the areas where people have returned are either partially or fully functional.
- As the winter season approaches, major concerns are stagnant water in many places, inadequate sanitation facilities, and limited access to health care.
- As part of the BISP flood relief assistance program, 97% of the government's cash disbursements worth over 67 billion PKR to 2.7 million beneficiaries have been completed.



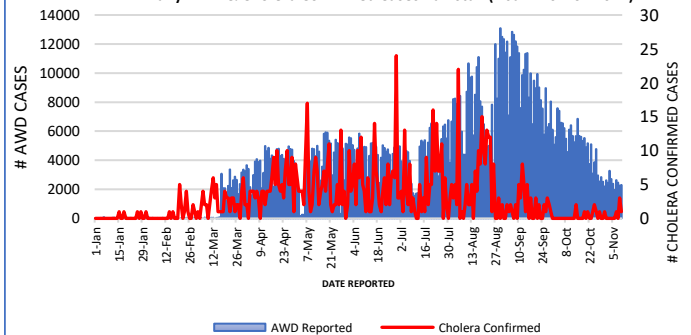
PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

- WHO continues to support screening for malnutrition among pregnant, lactating women and children under 5 years. In total WHO has screened 20,550 women (pregnant 8,510 and lactating 12,040) and 67,506 children under 5 years of age in 21 districts of Sindh. Overall MUAC <21 cm was found in 1,289 (15%) pregnant women and 1,608 (13%) lactating mothers. Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) found among 11.18% children, Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) in 4.69% and SAM with complications in 0.57% of children <5 years age.
- The daily incidence of AWD and Cholera cases are decreasing across Pakistan.
- Access to health services in the return areas is poor as most of the damaged health facilities are functioning below their capacity. The government with support from partners is continuing to provide mobile health services

WHO RESPONSE

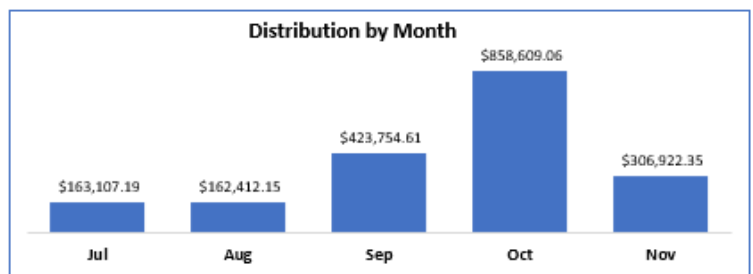
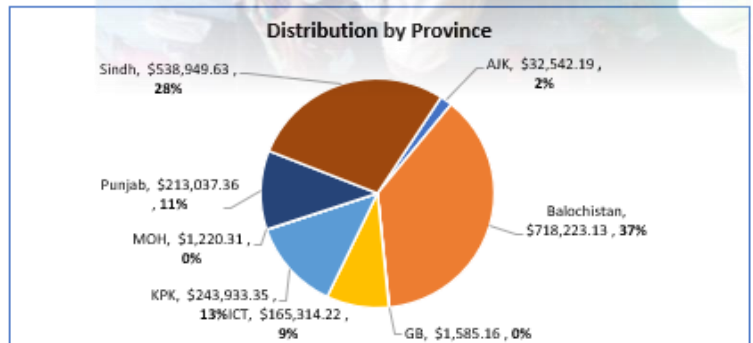
- The EPI program is conducting MR campaign in the flood-affected areas of Sindh and Punjab. The campaign is focusing on 25 districts of Sindh and two districts of Punjab. The campaign started on 7th November 2022. During the first two days of the campaign, 285,533 children (Punjab 100,976 and Sindh 184,557) were vaccinated.
- 12,508 health awareness sessions were conducted in floods affected districts on waterborne Diseases, Vector-borne diseases, Infection Prevention Control (IPC), TB, Skin infections, RMNCH & Psychosocial support, 191 LHS, 5,661 LHWs and 123 CSOs along with social mobilizers have been trained in Sindh and Balochistan Province.
- WHO Pakistan handed over 50,000 treatment courses of ACTs, 33,000 RDT kits, 40,000 dignity kits worth of USD 90,000 and 30,000 delivery kits worth of USD 165,000 to the department of health Sindh, Balochistan, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
- Renovation of Nutrition stabilization Center has been completed in 8 priority sites in the district Shikarpur, Kashmore, Larkana, Khairpur, Hyderabad, Kacchi and Jhal Magsi. 11 Human resources have been deployed in all the provinces.
