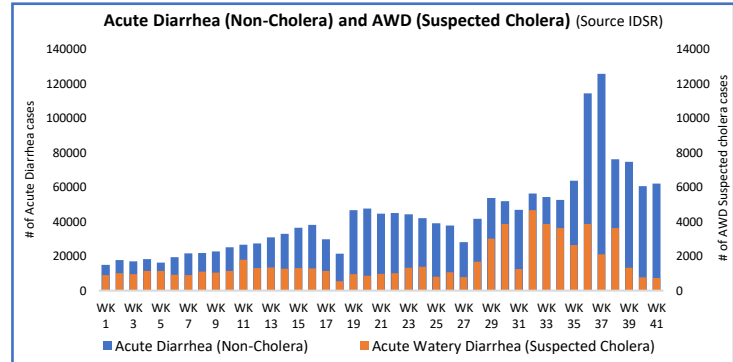
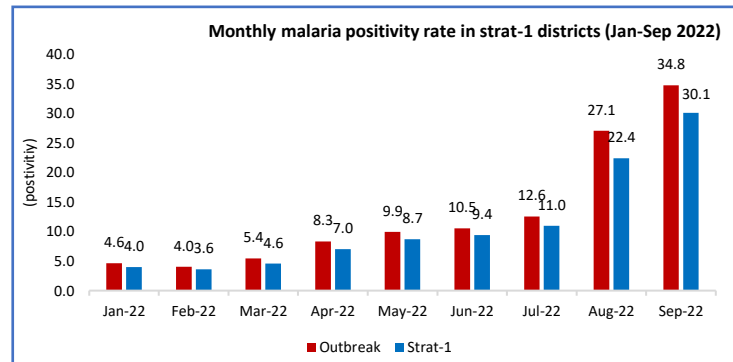
### SITUATION OVERVIEW

- In Sindh, according to PDMA report a total of 6,177,961 people were displaced by the floods, and 120,676 of those returned to place of origin
- Above 5 million people lack access to safe drinking water, and more than 7 million children and women need immediate nutrition assistance.
- There are increasing cases of water-borne and vector-borne diseases, especially in Sindh and Balochistan, where standing water is present.
- WHO Country Representative with his technical team visited the flood affected areas in Sindh from 11<sup>th</sup> - 20<sup>th</sup> Oct 2022 to support emergency response activities.



### PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS

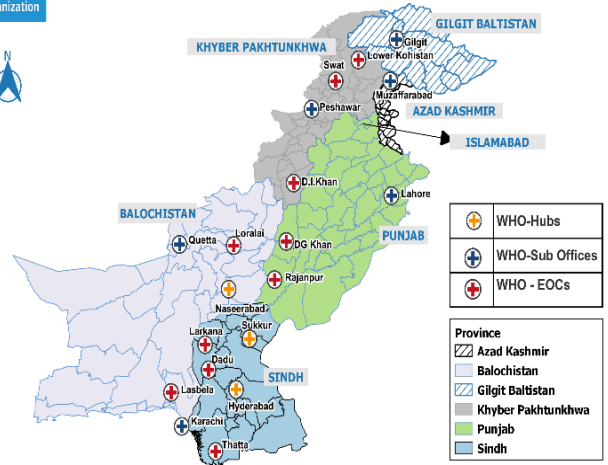
- Out of the 84 calamity hit districts 60 are in the Malaria stratum-1 (High endemic/epidemic prone districts). 32 out of 60 stratum-1 districts have been declared as malaria outbreak districts. Between August 2022 to date a total of 539,500 malaria cases have been reported/treated in these districts.
- The outbreak of dengue fever in Sindh, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province continues. A total of 10,553 new confirmed dengue fever cases have been reported between 11<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> October 2022. This number is expected to increase in coming months.
- The weekly incidence of diarrheal diseases (Acute diarrhea non-cholera and acute watery diarrhea suspected cholera) showing increasing trend since week 27 to week 39. Diarrheal disease is still a key concern due to the non-availability of safe drinking water or poor environmental conditions in flood affected districts.



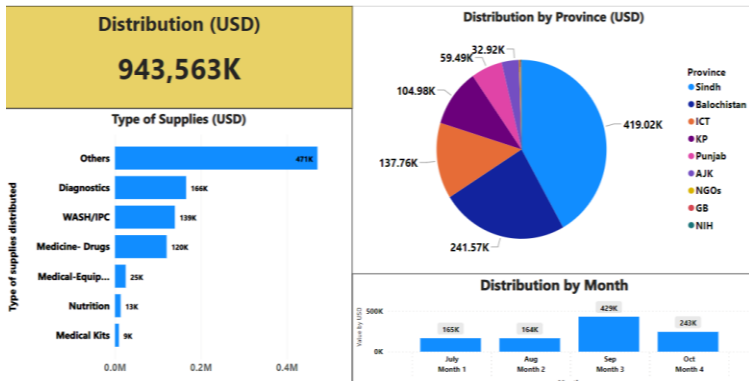
- The Oral Cholera Vaccine (OCV) campaign in 13 Union Councils of seven districts in KP namely Charsadda, Nowshera, Swat, Dir Upper, DI Khan and Tank is ongoing. So far, KP vaccinated 153,685 (81%) against the target.
- The WHO has scaled up flood relief and emergency operations by providing two water filtration plants in DHQ Hospital Dadu and DHQ Hospital Qambar Shahdadt.
- The World Health Organization has donated 30 vehicles for providing mobile health services in Sindh and 13 boats to reach areas still under water as part of its flood relief operations.
- WHO donates medicines, Rapid Testing Kits and Nutritional Supplements to health department of Sindh to strengthen essential health services provision. The medicines donated includes medicines for malaria.
- WHO nutrition program supported screened camp and 2041 children under five screened in the camps in the past 4 days. Among the children screened 13.7% had MAM (N=281), 7.9% had SAM (n=163), and 0.8% had SAM with complications (n = 16).
- WHO conducted briefing of partners, donor, UN agencies, INGOs, and NGOs in Sukkur, Sindh province. The briefing was co-chaired by DG Health Sindh and WR.



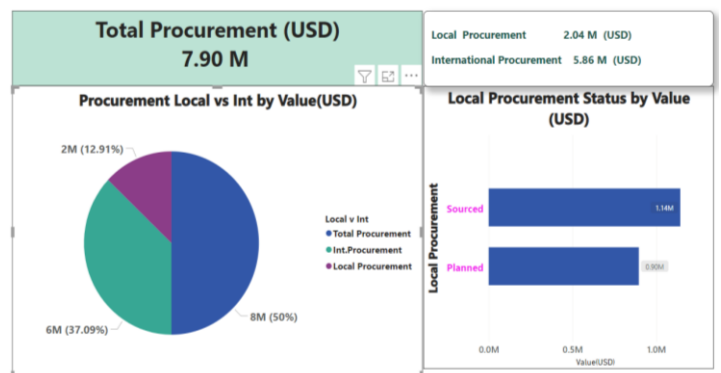
Map showing districts for WHO - EOCs, Hubs and Sub offices for flood response
