## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- 34% of the new cases are females and 9% children, the percentage who are Saudis was not reported.
- Cities with highest new infections: Riyadh (438), Jeddah (388), Dammam (345), Makkah (269), Qatif (217), Hufuf (183), Madinah (169) and Khamis Mushait (150).
- Saudi Arabia will allow Hajj (pilgrimage) for a limited number of people of different nationalities residing in the Kingdom.
- Ministry of Health doubles testing capacity from 18,000 PCR tests/day to 36,000.
- Ministry of Health launches a new coronavirus website in various languages, namely: English, Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Afghani, Filipino, Indonesian, in addition to Arabic, link to the new website: https://covid19awareness.sa/
- WHO updates criteria for releasing patients from isolation (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
