HIGHLIGHTS

- 37% of the new cases are female and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Jeddah (254), Hufuf (195), Riyadh (169), Taif (122), Makkah (116), Dammam (103), Al Mubarraz (102), Hafr Al Batin (91) and Madinah (65).
- Administrative courts have stopped dealing with lawsuits filed in paper and will only entertain e-litigation.
- A 107-year-old Saudi woman has recovered from COVID-19 after getting treatment in a Jeddah hospital.
- Pilgrims performing Hajj this year amid coronavirus pandemic have started home isolation.
- Penalties including 15 days in prison and a fine of SR 10,000 will be imposed on companies that transport pilgrims without Hajj permits.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million.
