



HIGHLIGHTS

- 38% of the new cases are female and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Jeddah (284), Riyadh (158), Taif (143), Makkah (107), Hufuf (105), Hafr Al Batin (100), Dammam (96) and Madinah (93).
- The number of recovered cases exceeds 200,000 accounting for more than 80% of the total cases.
- The decision to suspend prayers at the holy mosque in Makkah is still in effect.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million.
