HIGHLIGHTS

- 41% of the new cases are female and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (159), Taif (145), Riyadh (136), Al Mubarraz (121), Dammam (115), Khamis Mushait (105), Makkah (97) and Jeddah (96).
- New mechanism has been put in place in order to control pilgrims' entry and exit to Grand Mosque to ensure social distancing.
- At a virtual seminar titled "Together, we shall comeback", General Authority of Civil Aviation reviewed health measures taken in the Kingdom during coronavirus pandemic
- Grand Mosque in Makkah will remain closed to worshippers on Arafat day and Eid Al-Adha as part of precautionary measures.
- No date has been set for the resumption of international flights to and from Saudi Arabia.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million.
