#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- 38.7% of the new cases are female and 10.7% are children.
- Over the past 3 days, cities with highest new infections were: Makkah (417), Riyadh (400), Hufuf (397), Al Mubarraz (359), Dammam (298), Taif (282), Hafr Al-Batin (233), Khamis Mushait (216) and Madinah (199).
- First group of pilgrims arrived in Jeddah and were guided through precautionary and preventive requirements set by the Ministry of Health.
- Saudi Center for Disease Prevention and Control launches a coronavirus national registry to collect data about COVID-19 cases in the Kingdom.
- Saudi Arabia's embassies in Kuwait, Bahrain, UAE and Jordan have announced the opening of land ports for the return of Saudi citizens and their families without prior permission.
- MoH: Saudi Arabia conducted a total of 3 million PCR tests, with a daily capacity of 65,000 tests.
