HIGHLIGHTS

- \bullet On average, 45.5% of the new cases are female and 11.5% are children.
- Over the past 3 days, cities with highest new infections were: Riyadh (208), Jeddah (203), Hail (195), Makkah (186), Dammam (163), Hufuf (160), Jazan (155), Khamis Meshait (143), and Madina (140).
- Saudi Arabia to apply distance learning for first seven weeks of new school year 2020-2021.
- Civil Aviation: Field teams monitor the commitment of travellers and airport workers to precautionary measures.
- The Ministry of Sports prevents 6 people from entering matches after they were revealed by the "Tawakalna" application.
- More than 500 doctors in 30 specialties have volunteered to provide medical consultations with the We Are Sanad initiative.
