HIGHLIGHTS

- 46% of the new cases are female and 12% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Riyadh (62), Jazan (57), Jeddah (57), Makkah (56), Baish (43), Madina (36), Al Harjah (35), Sabt Al Alayah (35), Abu Arish (35), Hufuf (34), and Yanbu (33).
- More than 114,000 administrative employees in the schools will be back at work on Sunday in preparation for the new school year.
- The virtual school day in Saudi Arabia for intermediate and secondary stages will start at 7:00 a.m., and for elementary stage at 3:00 p.m.
- The Ministry of Education has issued a guide explaining the precautionary measures and the governance of the safe return to university studies to maintain the safety of students and staff.
- MoH: There are still no research or scientific studies linking the blood type and the level of infection strength with COVID-19.
