HIGHLIGHTS

- 46% of the new cases are female and 11% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (73), Hail (65), Makkah (64), Tabuk (64), Jazan (63), Madina (53), Abu Arish (52), Riyadh (45), Jeddah (43) and Dammam (42).
- Saudi Arabia's Embassy in the United Kingdom handed over the second batch of the Kingdom's gift to the British government to curb the spread of coronavirus.
- MoH issues an awareness guide for those infected, in close contact, or suspected of being infected with the new Corona virus.
- Extracorporeal membrane oxygenation has so far been used successfully on 32 patients suffering from acute respiratory problems caused by COVID-19.
