HIGHLIGHTS

- 45% of the new cases are female and 11% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Hail (81), Riyadh (64), Hufuf (62), Jazan (60), Makkah (55), Madina (52), Buraidah (51), Abha (49) and Jeddah (49).
- Jeddah Municipality have ordered the closure of 190 stores, including 59 workshops, for violating COVID-19 health protocols.
- King Faisal Specialist Hospital uses artificial intelligence tools to counter the Coronavirus.
- Saudi Arabia will host an "emergency meeting of heads of food regulatory authorities" today, which will be held within the programme of international conferences on the side-lines of the Kingdom's presidency of G20 in light of the challenges of the Corona pandemic.
- Recovery Rate of COVID-19 reaches 90.6%.
