





HIGHLIGHTS

- 45% of the new cases are female and 11% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Makkah (235), Hail (174), Jazan (173), Riyadh (155), Madinah (150), Jeddah (145), Samtah (110) and Tabouk (105).
- MoH provides COVID-19 health protocols to companies and organizations through its business call centre.
- Ministry of Human Resources and Social Development: All public employees will return to their workplaces next Sunday.
- MoH: The Kingdom completes 60 days without reporting MERS (Middle East Respiratory Syndrome) cases.
