## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- 43% of the new cases were female and 11% children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Jeddah (64), Makkah (42), Hufuf (41), Riyadh (30), Madinah (23), Dhahran (22), Yanbu (19) and Dammam (17).
- More than 100 Ugandan migrant workers returned home with International Organization for Migration support.
- Active cases witness a decrease of more than 75% from peak and new cases dip below 500 for the first time in 5 months.
- Weqaya updates the Health requirements and guidelines that must be adhered to in workers' housing.
- The regional laboratory at Northern Border Health obtains accreditation of Saudi CDC to conduct COVID-19 PCR testing.
- WHO publishes updated guidance on home care for patients with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 and management of their contacts, see link.
