# Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)

## Situation Report No. 16 - Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 30 March 2020

### HIGHLIGHTS

• Out of a total of 1,453 confirmed cases, 20 are in critical condition, and 115 recovered and were discharged;

• Out of 154 new cases reported yesterday, 16 were travel related, and 138 were contacts of previous cases;

• So far, no community transmission has been reported;

• Distribution of new cases: 40 in Makkah, 34 in Dammam, 22 in Riyadh, 22 in Madinah, 9 in Jeddah, 6 in Hufof, 6 in Khobar and 5 in Qatif; the remaining 10 cases are distributed in 9 other localities;

• The Royal Court clarifies that all nationals and residents will receive free COVID-19 care regardless of their legal status;

• Additional precautionary measures in a number of districts in Makkah, and Jeddah follows the same curfew hours as Riyadh;

• Over 2,500 individuals released from quarantine facilities;

• The WHO Director General thanked the King Salman Center for Humanitarian Relief for contributing US\$ 10 million during his media breifing.
