HIGHLIGHTS

- 43% of the new cases are female and 12% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections: Madinah (62), Riyadh (41), Yanbu (29), Makkah (24), Buraidah (14), Hufuf (11), Riyadh AlKhabra (9), Unayzah (9), and Hail (9).
- Ministry of Hajj and Umrah issues guidelines for Umrah performers (between the ages of 18 and 50) from Outside Saudi Arabia starting next Sunday.
- Ministry of Education announced that final examinations for the first semester of 1442 (school year 2020 2021) will be conducted remotely.
- Ministry of Health: the current levels of coronavirus cases in Saudi Arabia do not necessitate reinstating a curfew in the Kingdom.
