HIGHLIGHTS

- 42% of the new cases are female and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections: Madinah (46), Riyadh (44), Makkah (30), Yanbu (22), Khamis Mushait (17), AlMajmaah (16), Dammam (15), Hufuf (14), Wadi Al Dawasir (13), and Jeddah (12).
- The government approves to allocate SR 500,000 to the family of health practitioners who lost their life due to COVID-19 in the government or private sectors, whether civil or military and Saudi or non-Saudi.
- Ministry of Hajj and Umrah sets accommodation protocols for foreign Umrah pilgrims.
- 1,433,176 is the number of registered people on the platform E'atmarna to date.
