Probable COVID-19 case:

• A patient who meets clinical criteria (see *Important Definitions* in situation reports of last week) AND is a contact of a probable or confirmed case, or epidemiologically linked to a cluster with at least one confirmed case. • A suspect case with chest imaging showing findings suggestive of COVID-19 disease. • A person with recent onset of anosmia (loss of smell) or ageusia (loss of taste) in the absence of any other identified cause. • Death, not otherwise explained, in an adult with respiratory distress preceding death AND was a contact of a probable or confirmed case or epidemiologically linked to a cluster with at least one confirmed case.

Confirmed COVID-19 case:

A person with laboratory confirmation of COVID-19 infection, irrespective of clinical signs and symptoms.
