# Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)

## Situation Report No. 59 - Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

## Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 18 May 2020

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- 2,593 new cases in one day, bringing total to 57,345. Of the new cases, 44% are Saudis, 25% are females, and 11% children.
- 3,026 new recoveries, bringing total to 28,748.

• 8 new mortalities bringing total to 320. Mortalities were non-Saudis in Makkah, Jeddah, Madinah, Dammam and Buraidah; age range 27 - 64.

- There are 28,277 active cases, 237 of them in critical condition.
- Distribution of new cases: Riyadh (642), Makkah (510), Jeddah (305), Madinah (245), Dammam (174), Hofuf (147); in addition to cases in 46 other localities.

• Saudi Arabia participates in the 73rd session of the World Health Assembly with a delegation headed by the Minister of Health.

- A Saudi nursing staff died of COVID-19.
- MoH conducts approximately 602,000 coronavirus tests.

• Over 80% of supply and grocery stores have switched to using cashless electronic payments amid measures to stem the spread of the COVID-19.


• Uber has announced the launch of "Uber Medics" which provides health care workers with discounted trips during the Coronavirus pandemic.

• WHO: Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers; WHO has published new guidance on "Cleaning and disinfection of environmental surfaces in the context of COVID-19"; WHO provided guidance on school related public health measures (see link below).


