HIGHLIGHTS

- As reported on 26 June, third of new cases are females (34%) and 10% are children.
- Over the past 3 days, cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (1,171), Dammam (1,078), Makkah (923), Qatif (701), Riyadh (639) and Jeddah (632).
- Saudi Food and Drug Authority Joins WHO-National Control Laboratory Network for biological preparations established in 2016.
- More than 100 Saudi Red Crescent volunteers check temperature of worshipers going to mosques during Friday prayers.
- Saudi Food and Drug Authority: the average daily import of masks reached 10 million during the last 14 days.
- Repatriation programme continues with Saudis returning from a number of countries to the Kingdom.
- WHO updates criteria for releasing patients from isolation (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
