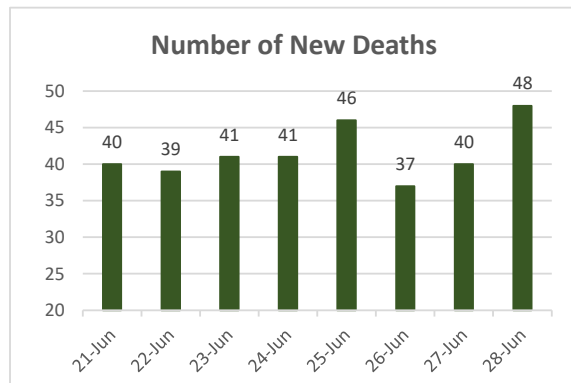
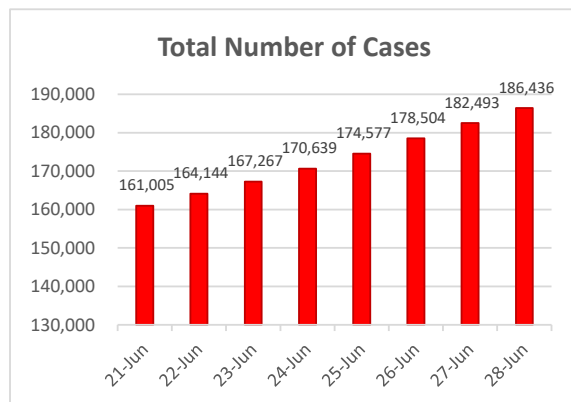
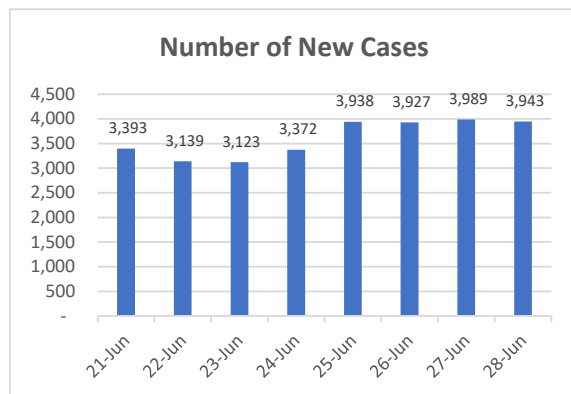

## HIGHLIGHTS

- 34% of new cases are females and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (433), Riyadh (363), Dammam (357), Makkah (263), Al Qatif (219), and Jeddah (212).
- There are more than 6,000 Saudi doctors who are engaged in combating coronavirus pandemic in 41 countries around the world.
- Saudi Arabia provided \$210 million to WHO, \$150 million to Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization, and \$150 million for Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations.
- UK visa services resume in Saudi Arabia.
- 40% of Haram's capacity likely to be used for Umrah and Tawaf.
- Agency for the Affairs of the Grand Mosque in Mecca is currently developing a crowd control plan for the partial opening of the mosque and the holy Kaaba soon.
- WHO updates criteria for releasing patients from isolation (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
