HIGHLIGHTS

• 37% of new cases are females and 9% are children.

• Cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (980), Riyadh (342), Al Mobarraz (323), Dammam (308), Makkah (287), Taif (229) and Jeddah (229).

- Tetamman clinics received 174 thousand visitors.
- The readiness of Hufuf railway station and its facilities are reviewed for observance of COVID-19 preventive protocols.
- MoH: Most of coronavirus cases are caused by people who failed to follow precautionary measures spreading infection to others.

MoH: It has not yet been proven that there is a relation between blood type and coronavirus infection.

• Teams from Ministry of Commerce ensured that all wholesale and retail trade stores were adhering to the approved preventive protocols to check the spread of coronavirus.


