HIGHLIGHTS

- 35% of new cases are females and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Riyadh (401), Dammam (283), Hufuf (229), Makkah (198), Al Qatif (173), Taif (172) and Jeddah (172).
- King Fahd Causeway is expected to be reopened by the end of July in line with strict protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19.
- The Kingdom's production of masks increased 5 times during the coronavirus crisis to reach 2.5 million masks daily, the target is to reach 10 million daily.

- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages (see link below).
