HIGHLIGHTS

- 36.3% of new cases are females and 10% are children.
- Over the past 3 days, cities with highest new infections were: Riyadh (1,140), Hufuf (893), Dammam (887), Makkah (693), Taif (674), Al Mobarraz (603), and Al Qatif (563).
- Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).
- More than 25 babies were born to women infected with coronavirus in Madinah, none of them had a positive PCR.
- MoH: 2,199 extra beds were added to intensive care units (ICUs) across the Kingdom within 90 days.
- The capacity of laboratories in the Kingdom have tripled to reach more than (53,000) coronavirus daily tests.
- More than (100) infected with COVID-19 benefited from treatment by convalescent patients' plasma.
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
