HIGHLIGHTS

- 35% of new cases are females and 65% are male.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Al Qatif (437), Khamis Mushait (364), Riyadh (330), Dammam (293), Taif (279), Hufuf (242), Jeddah (209), AlMobarraz (171) and Makkah (147).
- Precautionary measures including wearing face masks will be followed during Hajj including pilgrims and duty staff.
- If any pilgrims are found with symptoms of coronavirus in the midst of Hajj, they will be allowed to complete the rituals only after the assessment by a doctor, and that will be in the company of pilgrims with similar manifestations.
- 10,000 flights and over 750,000 travellers since the resumption of domestic flights on national air carriers.
- Saudi CDC announces health protocols for prevention of COVID-19 during Hajj.
- Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
