#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- 37% of the new cases are female and 11% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Riyadh (247), Jeddah (191), Hufuf (164), Dammam (157), Makkah (157), Taif (119), Khamis Mushait (119) and Al Mobarraz (99).
- Saudi Arabia has started implementing new health regulations for collective housing of 20 or more individuals.
- MoH: 50% of the critical cases in intensive care are 60 years old and above, 36% are between 40-60 years old, and 14% are between 20-40 years old.
- Ministry of Health publishes an infographic for the tasks of "Tettaman" clinics and "Taa'kad" centres.
- Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages, see link below.
- WHO clarifies comments made earlier regarding COVID-19 transmission, See link below.
