HIGHLIGHTS

- 37% of the new cases are female and 10% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections are: Jeddah (263), Hufuf (220), Riyadh (211), Al Mubarraz (189), Abha (141), Dammam (134), Hail (112), Taif (97), and Makkah (81).
- In Tabuk: Inauguration of the drive-through test centre with daily capacity of 400 tests and the COVID-19 testing unit in King Fahd Specialist Hospital with daily capacity of 350 tests.
- MoH: 132 person with Coronavirus benefited from convalescent plasma treatment.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million.
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages, see link below.
