# HIGHLIGHTS

• Global update: During the past week, the number of new COVID-19 cases has continued to decline for the third consecutive week, with a 19.7% decrease as compared to the previous week. Also the number of new weekly deaths continue to decline, decreasing 4.6% as compared to the previous week.

• **Regional update:** In the Eastern Mediterranean Region, new weekly cases have continued to decline since early February 2022. Just under 40,000 new weekly cases were reported last week, a 5.6% decrease as compared to the previous week. However, three (14%) countries in the Region have reported increases in new cases of 20% or greater, with the largest observed in Iran. The number of new weekly deaths in the Region decreased by 12.2% when compared to the previous week, with 505 new deaths reported.

#### • Saudi Arabia update:

- Dr Abdullah Asiri denied reports that Saudi Arabia will give a 4th dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to people in the age group 60 and above.

- Foreign pilgrims will account for 85% of the total number of 1 million pilgrims who will be allowed to perform Hajj this year. This year's Hajj is open to those who are under 65 years old and have received approved COVID-19 vaccinations. Pilgrims coming from outside the Kingdom are required to submit a negative COVID-19 PCR test result performed within 72 hours of the time of departure to the Kingdom.

• **COVID-19 variants**: The Omicron variant remains the dominant variant circulating. Among the 379,278 specimens collected in the last 30 days, 99.2% were Omicron and less than 0.1% were Delta, the remaining 0.8% were not assigned.

A small number of new Omicron sequences of BA.4 and BA.5 descendent lineages have now been detected in a few countries. Both have additional mutations in the Spike region and unique mutations outside of Spike. WHO is following up to assess their characteristics and public health consequences.
