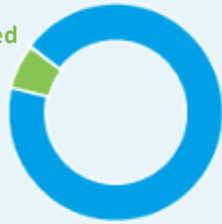
Funding Requirements in 2023

Funding overview

WHO requires US\$ 133 million to fully implement health interventions in Yemen in 2023. Funding requirements are aligned with the 2023 Yemen Humanitarian Response Plan. WHO health interventions target the most vulnerable communities, including those living in remote and hard-to-reach areas throughout the country, with urgent and lifesaving essential health services including primary and secondary care, maternal and child health, nutrition, and mental health. WHO also supports health systems strengthening to ensure sustained improvements in implemented response interventions.
